

This war, which went largely unnoticed among the Spanish public, was one of the bloodiest for the Spanish army: 300 dead from a battalion of 8,000 soldiers.

The ineptitude and inefficiency of the high ranking Spanish officials provoked defeat from the very beginning. Not even the visits of celebrities like Gila or Carmen Sevilla were enough to inspire the demoralized troops. Even the most equipped naval fleets could barely withstand the siege on Spanish Sahara. As a result, Spain quickly lost its colonies in Africa.
