

This book looks to analyze and understand the reasons that led to the outbreak of this war, the global event that caused Spain to lose its last colonial territories in the Americas and in Asia. Miguel del Rey has acted as director of the journal *Ristre* and is the author of *Guerra de la Oreja de Jenkins, La Guerra de los Diez Años* (1868-1878), *Las Guardias Reales en las Campañas de Italia*, and dozens of articles for various military history publications. He is a member of various historical research associations in Spain, France, and Great Britain.
