

The Middle East region the ancient Greeks called Mesopotamia, now the current Iraq, was the spiritual and intellectual heart of the country of the Tigris and the Euphrates. The prestige of Babylon had no rival in the eyes of its contemporaries. For its inhabitants the city was the centre of the universe, which stood out on its own in the civilized world. In the nerve centre of this great city of a challenging famous stepped tower rose, a Ziggurat universally known as the Tower of Babel.

A Brief History of Babylon reveals the true story of a city so intriguing and exciting as unknown, from its origin until its fall to the Persians in 539 BC. to this end, among other things, the great achievements of their two most emblematics monarchs will be analysed: Hammurabi (1792 - 1750 BC), author of one of the most ancient legal codes known, and Nebuchadrezzar II (605 - 562 BC), the last great Babylonian King who completed the construction of the Tower of Babel and conquered the very Jerusalem.

Biography

Juan Luis Montero Fenollós (Lorca, 1968) holds a PhD in History by the University of Barcelona (1996) and has been a researcher of the Institute of the Middle East for the same University (1993- 2001). Currently he is a Professor of Ancient History in the Faculty of Humanities of the University of A Coruña, of which he is also Associate Dean.



He directs the Middle Euphrates Syrian Archaeological Project since 2005. In 2009 he was appointed Knight of the Order of Academic Palms, highest decoration granted by the French Ministry of Education.
