

Biography

José Miguel Cabañas Agrela has a Masters Degree in Geography and History from the Complutense University of Madrid.

He is an expert on the second half of the 16th Spanish and European century, who has focused his work on the study of international and diplomatic relations between the Spain of Philip II and the England of Elizabeth I through the figure of the Spanish Ambassador in that Court, Don Bernardino de Mendoza (Ambassador, writer, soldier and spy), a very complete character and whose career centred him always in the crucial centres of power, and of the most important events of the reign Felipe II.



Author of *Don Bernardino Mendoza, a writer and soldier to the service of the Catholic monarchy* (1541-1604) and *Sodomite Kings,* where we find the narration of the life and passions of a series of monarchs of the Europe during the Renaissance and Baroque, whose reputation for the same gender preference started already from the moment their reigns began. Versatile historian, he dares to narrate any event as if he had lived it, with great historical and intellectual rigour, but with a simple and direct language that engages the reader.

He is a regular contributor in the magazine La Aventura de la Historia and in the Spanish Biographical Dictionary (RAH), where he wrote the biographies of several key characters from the monarchy of Philip II.


