

He is a member of the Society of Basque Studies and contributor to Radio Onda Vasca on a weekly program devoted to the dissemination of history. He is the author of many articles that have been published in several journals such as Jeanne d'Albret, Queen of the Huguenots; Ming China; The Invasion of the Hundred Thousand Sons of Saint Louis; The Witches of Zugarramurdi or The Assassination of Henri IV. He has also published several historical essays: A Brief history of fascism, A Brief History of the Spanish Civil War, A Brief History of the Russian Revolution, Mao's China and the socio-political study The Great Utopia. He is also the author of three historical novels: El testamento, La alternativa Garat and Sinfonía guerrera.
