Synopsis

A Brief history of the Cathars narrates the events related to the Cathar heresy and the crusade organized by the papacy to fight it. It combines two views that had not appeared so far on the same work: the French perspective, and the Catalonian- Aragonese point of view. The result of this merge is a work that breaks all topics that have existed so far with regard to the work published on the Cathars: books of excellent French medievalists, too specialized and cumbersome for the general readership; works by Spanish authors of regionalist character that state wrong conclusions too slightly, for their own school are true dogmas; and works of occult and esoteric character, where historical accuracy is conspicuous by its absence. In short, every single lover of Medieval History or the History of Religions, without being necessarily an expert on the subject, would be delighted to read an easy reading, rigorous and entertaining book on the Cathars. It is a serious History work, not sensationalist, that includes the wise knowledge about the heresies of Western Europe possessed by the French medievalists as well as the experience of the Spanish historians on the Catalonian-Aragonese expansion, relating very pertinently the revealing information provided by these two medievalists schools.
