

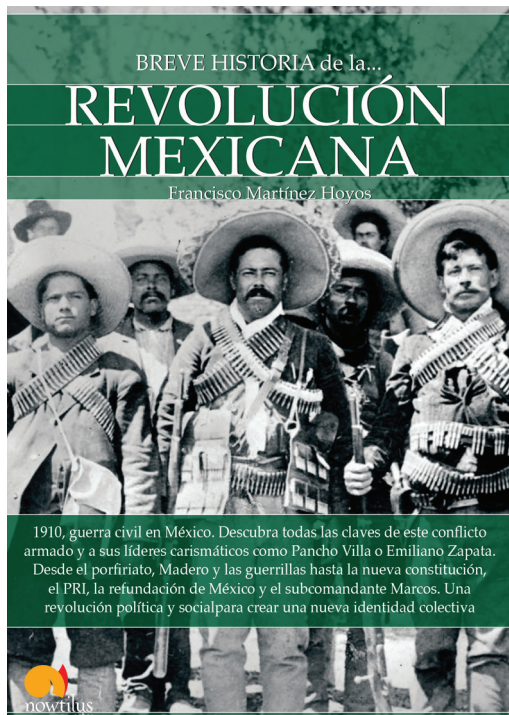

He is also a columnist and critic whose writings have appeared in *Cultura* (La Vanguardia's cultural supplement magazine), *Historia y Vida*, *El Ciervo* o *Spagna Contemporánea*.
