He has been awarded with several national prizes of poetry, the author has been approved by writers of a standing equal to Gonzalo Torrente Ballester or Antonio Gala. *The Amazing History of the Classical music* is his second essay, dedicated to his other great passion: music, and on which he is brimming with his impulsive and different way of telling the facts.
