All these concepts, materialized in the Italian Duilio of 1876, and brought to its maximum expression with the British Dreadnought of 1906, will mark the history of the armoured ship in universal battles like Tsushima (1905), Jutland (1916) or Gulf of Leyte (1944).

The battleships wrote almost a century as "kings of the Seas", finishing their execution with famous names of the SGM like Hood, Bismarck, Yamato or Jean Bart, protagonists of epic legendary feats.
