

This work reviews the history of the most famous treasure findings of submerged ships, according to the chronology of shipwrecks (not the discoveries, and location of the wrecks) including the most famous plunders, surveys and research since mid-20th century to the more recent ones, compared to other cases that should have been taken by examples carried out simultaneously or subsequently.
